### 2011-2012

#### **Tapping Our Possibilities: \$930**

Grant funds will be used to purchase an iPad that will provide unlimited learning opportunities for students who experience autism, behavioral challenges and cognitive disabilities. Students will be able to use the iPad as not only a tool to access academic content, but also for communication, behavior management, social skills, fine motor practice and more.

#### **Making Math Count: \$5,000**

##### **Funding provided through the BEF Building STEAM 4 All Program**

The Making Math Count program will provide additional math instruction and practice for third through fifth grade students, many of whom lack the support and resources to practice math concepts they are learning in class. Struggling math students will receive assistance outside the normal school day, including guided use of computer technology to support the Everyday Math program.

### 2010-2011

#### **Wii Fit Recess: \$955**

The goal of this project is to provide engaging recess experiences for students in the self-contained special education classroom. The Wii games will provide opportunities for social, cognitive, and physical experiences in a structured environment. Once the students have learned the game basics, mainstream peers will be invited to join them to enhance the connection between all students.

### 2002-2003

#### **Family Reading Club: \$1,000**

Seeking to develop a multicultural literacy program, this project will support struggling readers by providing their parents with strategies and skills to assist in their child's reading comprehension development. Family Reading Club will bring students in grades three through five and their families together for a monthly literature circle discussion of a multicultural text that they have read together at home. The Club will provide families with an opportunity to become involved in the school community, participate in their child's academic growth and gain skills in helping their child develop reading comprehension skills.
